Home Tour 2025– Be a part of the Committee!

Typically, in January we begin the process of forming a Committee for the Home Tour that is held on the first full weekend in December. Among the tasks associated with the Event are we need members to oversee the Home Coordinator, Boutique Coordinator, Volunteer Coordinator, Publicity Coordinator, Refreshments Coordinator, Home Decorator and Pick a Prize Coordinator. These are not 1 person jobs; many get a team of 2 – 4 to coordinate each component.

Duties:

Home Coordinator: find homes to feature on the tour. 3 applications have been received to date. We typically like 5, and homes do not have to be members, as we allow community homes as well. Once the 5 homes are selected, a visit to the homes to find out what quilts will be needed to decorate, and which of our special displays of boutique, refreshments, Opportunity Quilt, Pick a Prize and Education Outreach/Veteran of the Month, would fit best. This could be done in one day, and having the Home Decorator with will facilitate the process.

Boutique Coordinator: Collect merchandise, suggest ideas for merchandise, mark items with prices, arrange and sell the merchandise at the event. This component brought in over half of our profit last time.

Volunteer Coordinator: is responsible for having sufficient hostesses in each house to greet visitors, answer questions and keep home safe from damage or theft.

<u>Publicity Coordinator</u> arranges for printing and distribution of tickets, posters, bookmarks and flyers. Tickets are distributed to nearby Quilt Shops to be sold. Also, responsible for newspaper articles and television coverage and getting signs out directing visitors to the houses.

Refreshments Coordinator: Collect cookies and cider from members and arrange them at one of the homes.

Home Decorator: is responsible for checking in and out members' quilts and quilted items that will be displayed. She will distribute the quilts to the home and assist in displaying them.

<u>Pick a Prize Coordinator:</u> will assemble baskets and sell raffle tickets at one of the homes.

So, at the January Meeting a sign up sheet will go around for members who want to volunteer for one of the Coordinator positions. We've got this event pretty much down pat, we just need you to step up and help. Best yet, have a long-time member take a new member under your wing and show her the ropes.
