About the Guild...continued

Board meetings shall be held monthly at the time and place designated by the President. Currently they are generally held the first Monday of each month at 10 am at the conference room at Trilogy Construction in Paradise.

Any member is welcome to attend board meetings and have a voice, but only the members of the Executive board are eligible to vote. Anything voted at the Board meeting shall be brought to the general meeting.

General members with items they feel need to be discussed should put their concerns in writing and present it to the Executive board at the monthly board meeting. If there is no board meeting that month, the written concerns should be presented to the president one (1) week prior to the general meeting to be placed on the agenda. Meeting location, date and time shall be published in the Guild newsletter, calendar, and website.

Special meetings for stated purposes may be called at the will of the Executive Board, or by petition of ten members. The membership will be notified by announcement at the regular meeting, newsletter or by telephone.

Non-budgeted amounts may be approved by the Executive Board without the approval of the General Membership not to exceed guidelines in operating procedures in one fiscal year.

Duties of standing committees: All committee chairpersons must keep accurate financial records and report them on a quarterly basis to the treasurer for verification. If a committee exceeds their budgeted amount by 10%, additional expenditures must be approved by the Executive Board.

Block of the Month 2025-2026

We've made 2 sample blocks to help you decide on fabric placement. Notice that one block uses 3 fabrics and the other 4. That will be your choice.

The July block is Blockheads 3 - block 51 from Moda.

There is also a helpful hint included. This block requires sewing diagonally across a square. I have found that sometimes my machine "eats" points. Therefore, I always sew from a straight edge whenever possible. Now if you are making HST (half square triangles) that won't be possible. You have to start at a point.
