The meeting was called to order by Kim Morris at 10:05 a.m.

Old Business

 Kim asked all to silence their phones.
Russell Troge is our February Veteran of the Month. He served for 30 years in the Air Force. He has been very active in the Disabled Veterans of America in Paradise Chapter 106. 3. Leslie Bruening moved that we accept the minutes from our January meeting as printed in the Newsletter. Judy Martinez seconded the motion. It was approved unanimously.

4. Kim reported that in January we spent \$4,150.61, mostly on rent and insurance. We re-

ceived \$569.75. 5. For our Home Tour in December we still need a Volunteer Coordinator and a Publicity Coordinator and a Chairperson.

New Business

1. Opportunity Quilt. Ladies of Lake (Lake County) brought their Opportunity Quilt titled 'Shelly's Flower on the Lake'. It was made by Shelly Aldridge, their guild's founding member. She did all of the piecing and quilting. She owned a quilt shop in Kelseyville for many years.

2. Nominating Committee. We need three volunteers to serve on a Nominating Committee for next year. They would need to check with current officers and committee chairpersons to see if they are willing to continue. Kim has agreed to stay on as Treasurer. The President and Secretary still have a year left on their two year term. We need a vicepresident for Programs and a vice-president for Workshops and a person or committee to take over Community Service. Our by-laws say that if we cannot fill the positions on our board that we need to dissolve. So this is a serious need.

3. Opportunity Quilt 2026. The pattern 'Eureka' has been suggested. It will be the 250th anniversary year of our country so we would like to do it in patriotic colors. We need volunteers to make it.

4. Signage for Quilt Show 2026. We bought some new sidewalk signs and will need a committee to design signage before we can use them.

5. Show and Tell. These members shared their new projects: Speri Machuga, Joan McWilliams, Mary Ann Hagan, Betty Iijima, Laura Green, Tina Bourdette, Cherylann Bullock, Leeanne Kromer, Victoria Patterson, and Kim Morris.

About the Guild ...

The mission statement for Ridge Quilters' Guild as stated in Article II, Section 2.01 of our bylaws reads, *"The Guild in a nonprofit organization whose mission is to promote quilting through educa-tion, exhibitions, programs, workshops and to encourage philanthropic quilting for the benefit of our Guild, community, state and country."* Section 2.02 further describes our purpose as follows: *"The Guild shall be organized for education and charitable purposes with the section 501 (C)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. All activities of the Guild shall be conducted in such a manner that no part of the net income shall inure to the benefit of any individual member, except that the Guild shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered."*

Activities that further our mission include our monthly meeting programs, workshops, the Quilt Show and Home Tour (which also provide fundraising opportunities), Education Outreach, Block of the Month, and Community Quilts. We also promote quilting when we participate in community events and when we enjoy each other's company in the social aspects of the guild.
