Well, how is it going? Are you finished with your flying geese? The method described in the September pattern is my favorite way to make flying geese, if you are accurate in your cutting, you should not have points cut off when sewing them together. Practice makes perfect. With October's BOM, you will get plenty of practice making hst's, looking over the pattern, think about spinning your seams so the intersections lay flat. Yes, it's October, that means something has to be orange, right, and funny thing, the selvage includes the word "spirit" in it! Have fun, it will be fun to see how many different ways this month's pattern will be interpreted!
